Internship Description

This Internship position will work directly within [REAP's Farm to Community Programs](#) to promote, develop, and facilitate Summer Programming Initiatives that focus on food justice, food sovereignty, sustainability through the local food system, and culturally-relevant health, wellness, and nutrition education for the Latinx/indigenous families and youth in the Greater Madison Area. This internship is an excellent opportunity for those with interests in food justice, food sovereignty, sustainability, and the local food system.

This position generally requires the ability to lift up to 50 pounds and the ability to traverse potentially uneven city park and event location terrain with reasonable accommodation. Travel throughout the city of Madison is required, with the interns providing their own means of transportation. Mileage reimbursement is available for work-related travel in a personal vehicle.

Internship responsibilities

The F2F Intern will work alongside the REAP Farm to Community Coordinator and will be responsible for facilitating the [Farms to Families Resilient Bags Program](#) by helping with sourcing, storing, packing, creating packing list, communicating with Second Harvest staff when needed; working with [Roots4Change](#) Promotoras to support activities of *Verano en Familia*; working in close communication with the Community Engagement Intern, and other related tasks.

Desired Qualifications

- Bilingual Spanish-English
- Personable
- Flexibility to work on one or two Saturdays
- Experience in education, nutrition, environmental science, or agriculture
- Experience working with youth not necessary but desirable
- Experience interacting with socially, economically, racially and/or ethnically diverse populations
- Familiar with use of software related to drafting documents and other printed materials

Hours and Pay Rate

The internship will run from June 15 - August 28th, and will require up to 15 hours per week, with an average of 10-12 hours/week. Pay rate of \$18.00 per hour.
